

Troy University Non-immigrant Alien Visa Policy

Policy Statement:

Troy University will sponsor Visas in the following categories: H-1b, F-1 and J-1 for practical or academic training, TN, O-1, and Immigrant Visas. Visas will be sponsored only for full-time faculty and staff positions requiring a minimum of a Master's level degree.

Policy Objective: Troy University must comply with federal regulations regarding the employment of foreign nationals (non-United States citizens and non-permanent residents). It is important to ensure that each foreign national employed or on academic appointment at Troy either has an immigration status which permits that affiliation or has been granted permission by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS).

General Proviso: Hiring supervisors will not issue faculty contracts or make commitments for employment that would exceed time limitations of the alien employee's current or planned Visa status.
