New Heritage Scholarship  
to benefit children of alums

Alumni now have an even greater incentive to send their children to Troy University.

The Heritage Scholarship specifically benefits children whose parents graduated from Troy University. The scholarship will be implemented in the fall of 2007.

“This scholarship encourages our alumni who are parents to continue a tradition by encouraging their children to attend TROY,” said Faith Ward, director of Alumni Affairs. “It also has the potential to increase enrollment and establish legacies.”

The scholarship is for first-time, full-time freshmen at any Alabama campus who are unconditionally admitted to the University with a 3.0 grade-point average. It will provide \$500 for one academic year.

“The Heritage Scholarship creates a higher level of goodwill and allegiance among alumni who have children considering Troy University,” said Buddy Starling, dean of admissions.

Funding for the Heritage Scholarship will be provided through investment returns from the University’s “Car Tag Scholarship” Fund.
