TROY Online Refund Policy

You are responsible for all charges that result from registering for classes. When dropping a course, you may still be required to pay at least a portion of the cost for that course:

Drop policy:

If dropping an online course or an in-class course taught at a TROY Service Center:

- 1. During the first week of the term, you owe 0%.
- 2. During the second week of the term, you owe 50%.
- 3. During the third week of the term or anytime thereafter, you owe 100%.
- 4. This policy does not apply to the State of Georgia and Pacific Region due to existing contractual agreements.

If dropping a course at a Troy University – Alabama Campus location:

- 1. During the first week of the term/semester (Monday Monday), you owe 0%.
- 2. During the second week of the term/semester or anytime thereafter, you owe 100% of tuition and fees, plus an additional drop fee will be assessed for each dropped class.
- 3. No refund of charges will occur after the first week of class. For weekend classes, no reduction of charges will occur after the second class meeting.

Withdrawal policy:

If a student wishes to withdraw from all classes from the University, the student may be entitled to a partial refund of the tuition. Refund percentages are defined in the term schedules.

1. For Troy University - Alabama Campus Locations

Official withdrawal will result in 100% refund of charges for tuition, laboratory fees, technology fees and student activity fees through the first week of classes (seven calendar days from the start date of the term/semester). No refund of these charges will occur after the first week of the semester/term begin date (Monday – Monday). For weekend classes, no reduction of charges will occur after the second class meeting.

Please note: a withdrawal fee will be assessed.

2. For TROY Online and TROY Service Center Locations

- a. 100% refund for any withdrawal during the first week of classes
- b. 50% refund for withdrawal from the end of the first week of classes through the end of the second week of classes
- c. 0% refund for any withdrawal after the end of the second week of classes
- d. This policy includes distance learning and weekend classes.
- e. This policy does not apply to the State of Georgia and Pacific Region due to existing contractual agreements.

SPECIAL NOTES ON REFUNDS FOR WITHDRAWALS:

- 1. Students who withdraw from the University may qualify for a refund if medical reasons can be documented and processed through the designated withdrawal official (DWO).
- 2. Applications fees, registration fees, and housing deposits are non-refundable fees.
- 3. A student called for military service during the school term should consult with Student Financial Services or VA Counselor, as applicable regarding refunds of fees before withdrawing.
- 4. Room rent is non-refundable.
- 5. Meal plans may be canceled if a student withdraws from the university. The refund will be prorated on a weekly basis on the unused portion of the meal plan. The meal plan must be paid for through the date the withdrawal is processed.

If a student does not meet his/her financial or other obligations, he/she will not be permitted to register for any subsequent term. The University will not issue official transcripts and the student will not receive a diploma, if graduating, until such obligations are met.

Delinquent student accounts may be reported to a credit bureau and referred to collection agencies for collections that will levy a 33 1/3% collection fee in addition to the debt or litigation. All financial regulations, fees and charges are subject to change as conditions warrant.

Book charges are not reduced/forgiven for drops or withdrawals. Please contact your campus's Barnes & Noble bookstore to inquire about their return policy.
