#### TROY UNIVERSITY HISTORY

Troy University's tradition of teaching excellence dates to its founding on February 26, 1887, when an act of the Alabama Legislature established State Normal School, Troy, as an institution to train teachers for Alabama's schools. Joseph Macon Dill was the institution's first president. In 1893, the school was renamed Troy State Normal College.

Troy State Normal College offered extension courses for teachers and granted teaching certificates until 1929, when the State Board of Education changed the charter of the institution. That same year, the State Legislature changed the name to Troy State Teacher's College, and the college moved to its present site and dedicated the first two buildings: Shackelford Hall, named for Edward Madison Shackelford, president of the school from 1899-1936; and Bibb Graves, Alabama's "education governor." In 1957, the Alabama State Legislature changed the name to Troy State College.

The decade of the 1950s also marked the University's long relationship with the United States military, as extension courses were offered on nearby bases. A separate Troy State College teaching center was established at Fort Rucker in 1961. By the mid- 1970s, Troy State University at Fort Rucker had outgrown the available facilities, and Wallace State Community College in Dothan offered the use of classrooms. In 1975, classes were moved to the Houston Hotel in Dothan. In spring 1990, the Dothan Campus moved to its new location on U. S. Highway 231 North, and in 1995, Troy State University Dothan became the official name.

In April 2004, the Board of Trustees voted to drop State from the University's name to reflect more accurately the institution's worldwide mission. This change was approved by the Alabama Legislature, and the University officially became Troy University. In August 2005, all TROY campuses became unified under one accreditation.

#### The Origin and History of Academic Regalia

The wearing of academic regalia goes back a long way, to the 12th century. Everyone wore "gowns"—long robes— in those days, and for a very good reason: to keep warm. When the styles finally changed, professional people alone wore the gown as a visible token of their profession.

The hood came along in the 13th century. Originally it was called a "chaperon," and was a kind of pointed bag with an oval opening for the face. It went through several phases, including one as a turban, before it settled down to its present shape and function, the latter being an indicator of rank as shown by color combinations.

As for the mortarboard (also called cap and originally "Biretta"), its origin is not so well documented. Some say it was derived from the master workman's actual mortar board. Others say it began at Oxford, and was named for that school's quadrangular campus. The best guess is that, inasmuch as university men in the Middle Ages wore close-fitting skull caps inside the cold and draughty buildings and put the soft square biretta on over the skull cap when they went outdoors, the mortarboard resulted from combining the two into a single head covering.

The degree colors are appropriate to the category of the degree, rather than to the scholar's major subject. For example, the appropriate color for degrees in Arts and Letters is white; in Business, drab; in Education, light blue; in Law, purple; in Music, pink; in Nursing, apricot; in Philosophy, dark blue; in Religion, scarlet; in Science, golden yellow. These colors are used for the trim of all hoods and may be used for the velvet facing and sleeve bars on doctors' gowns and tassels on bachelors' and masters' caps. The institutional colors, with which the hoods are lined, indicate the university or college granting the degree. The colors for Troy University are cardinal and black.

Academic regalia have survived the changes and upheavals of the centuries. Long, long ago, they identified the scholar, the learned student, the seeker after truth. At Troy University, they still do.
