Int. scene two- at Natalie's House

<u>NATALIE</u> walks into her house later that night and goes into her office. She looks down at her desk and a piece of paper sitting on it. She sighs and then begins writing. Once she is done, she reads it aloud to herself. Natalie

Dear younger self,

On Thursday, September 12, 2009, you're driving our daughter, Grace, home from school. You run into traffic on the interstate and decide to take the backroads. Don't. If you do, while you're driving home, a deer jumps out in front of your car and Grace dies.

Signed, Your wiser self.

She seals the letter and address it. She looks down at it and says to herself,

Natalie

This is stupid.

She gets up and begins to walk out of the room but turns around and grabs a stamp from a box on her desk and puts it on the letter. She now walks out of the room and turns off the light. Behind her, the envelope glistens and then disappears.

Int. Scene three- at natalie's house

NATALIE yawns and sits up in her bed. She slips her feet into slippers and put on a robe. She walks down the hall and into the kitchen. She grabs a mug from the counter and pours a cup of coffee. From behind, she hears,

Grace

Good morning mom.

NATALIE turns around and drops the mug, causing it to shatter. Tears begin forming in her eyes.

<u>Natalie</u>

Oh my gosh, Grace, you're here! You've grown since I last saw you! I missed you so much.

NATALIE walks over and gives a very confused GRACE a giant hug.

Grace

I literally saw you last night, mom. You're acting weird. And since when do you drink coffee?

Natalie

Oh right. I forgot I didn't drink coffee before you...

Grace

Are you sure you're feeling okay?

Natalie

Yeah, I'm fine.

She suddenly remembers the letter and abruptly begins walking out.

Natalie

I need to go check on something.

She walks back down the hall into her office and sits down at the desk to find that the envelope had been opened and there is no longer a letter inside. The stamp is also missing from the outside. Once she realizes this, she frantically grabs the stamps from her desk and takes them out of the envelope they are in. She examines them and then notices a message on the back. She reads it aloud.

Int. scene four- at Natalie's house

NATALIE walks in with GRACE that night.

<u>Grace</u>

I'm excited for the fall dance next Wednesday.

Natalie

Are sure you don't want to go with someone?

Grace

No. Just no. You don't know the guys in my grade.

Natalie

Okay, I understand. Don't you have some homework to do?

<u>Grace</u>

Yeah. You know how Mrs. Bryant loves giving way too much math homework.

<u>Natalie</u>

I'm going to do a little work myself. Back in a second.

<u>NATALIE</u> walks down the hall and into her study. She sits down and begins writing another letter. Once she is done, she reads it to herself.

<u>Natalie</u>

Dear younger me,

I have one more piece of advice for you. There's a man you meet in college named Nick. For some reason, you let him go for Grace's father. Don't. Other than Grace, Nick is the best thing that ever happened to you. Don't make the mistake of letting him get away.

Signed, a more experienced you.

<u>NATALIE</u> sighs and seals the letter, addresses it, and then puts her second stamp on it. She leaves it on the desk and then walks out of the room.

Int. Scene five- At Nick's house

NATALIE wakes up in a different bed, in a different house. She is thoroughly confused with her surroundings and walks out into a large entryway and goes to what she assumes is the kitchen. She comes into NICK cooking pancakes for their two children. NICK gives her a kiss on the cheek when she walks over to where is he standing.

Nick

<u>NATALIE</u> walks over to the large refrigerator and gets out the protein shake as promised. She take a sip and <u>comments</u>,

Natalie

This is really good. Thank you.

Nick

It's what I make every morning, but you're welcome.

<u>NATALIE</u> goes over to the table where her kids are sitting, waiting patiently for pancakes. The younger one says.

Avery

Mommy! Daddy is making us pancakes!

Natalie

So I see.

Luke

How did you sleep?

Natalie

Fine. How about you?

Luke

Good. Maxwell licked me awake at about six thirty, but really good other than that.

If you feel like you need to, please do. I can get the kids to school today.

Natalie

Thanks Nick, you're the best.

<u>She walks out of the kitchen and goes back upstairs. She grabs her phone from the nightstand and calls someone.</u>

Natalie

Hey Lara. I know it's a long shot, but what's the chance you could see me today? It's important.

Int. scene six- at Lara's office

A very stressed NATALIE walks into LARA'S office and sits down.

Natalie

Thanks for getting me in Lara.

Lara

Of course. I can't say that we've met before.

Natalie

No, we have. Just not in this reality.

Lara

Oh?

Natalie

What I'm about to tell you is going to sound insane, but I need you to believe me.

Lara

I'll do my best.

Natalie

Two days ago, I came in here because I needed help dealing with the guilt of my daughter dying in a car crash because I took a different route. You told me to write a letter to my younger self and I did. I didn't know that I had accidentally addressed it with a magical stamp that sent it to my younger self. I woke up the next day and my daughter Grace was there. That night, I wrote another letter telling myself not to let go of my dream guy Nick. I woke up today and now I live in a huge house with Nick, two sweet kids, a border collie named Maxwell, and tons of free time. Int. scene eight- at Natalie's house

Shots show only her slippers as she does this so there is no way to see what house she is in.

She smiles and walks out into the kitchen, finally looking up, to where Grace is eating cereal.

Natalie

Morning, sweetie.

<u>Grace</u>

Morning mom. How did you sleep.

Natalie

Really good. You know something, Grace? Real is a lot better than perfect.

Grace

That makes sense. It's really random, but it makes sense.

Natalie

I love you.

<u>Grace</u>

I love you too, mom.

Come on. We have to get you to school.

They walk out the front door and NATALIE turns around to survey their house. She smiles and sighs before turning the lights out and closing the door behind her.
