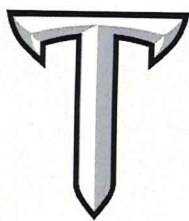

Troy University is seeking proposals for an X-ray diffractometer (XRD), on behalf of our Chemistry & Physics Department. All proposals will be reviewed in terms of quality versus costs. Troy University reserves the right to accept or reject proposals in accordance with the Code of Alabama 1975, Title 41 Chapter 16. The University reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive all formalities if it is deemed in the best interest of the University to do so. This bid can be cancelled at any time if funding becomes unavailable. Please note, Troy University is tax exempt.

The awarded vendor is required to provide a performance bond for 10% of the contract amount (mandatory requirement). The awarded vendor will receive an authorized University purchase order following the receipt of the performance bond. No goods can be delivered and no work is to begin without an official Troy University purchase order. If a performance bond is not received, the bid will be rejected and awarded to the next lowest responsible bidder.

Purpose/use: X-ray analysis on the crystallinity of powder and other samples

The instrument must meet the following minimum specifications:

- A floor-standing system, but not benchtop system
- The measuring circle diameter between 435 mm and 600 mm, or a wider range from 435 mm to more than 600 mm
- Vertical goniometer with Theta/Theta geometry
- Angular range of 360°
- Maximum usable angular range from -110° to 168° (2 Theta) or wider

- Instrument alignment equal or better than $\pm 0.01^\circ 2\theta$
- A minimum resolution of $0.028^\circ 2\theta$ at $\sim 30^\circ 2\theta$ in Bragg-Brentano geometry
- Maximum angular speed of 20° per second
- The power for the X-ray tube should be 1 kW or higher
- A PC to control the spectrometer needs to be included. Minimum specifications for the PC: 8 GB RAM, 1.0 TB SATA hard drives, and 19" LED monitor
- A software for interpretation of one and two-dimensional X-ray power diffraction data needs to be included. Include at least 10 academic licenses for different users.
- Upgradeable to twin or trio optics
- Able to accommodate Cr, Co, and Cu radiation
- Minimum 3-year manufacture warranty on X-ray tubes
- Integrated temperature system that allows operation from -180°C to 450°C in vacuum, and from room temperature to 300°C without vacuum
- A dewar vessel of 25 liters or more for liquid nitrogen for low temperature experiments
- On-site training provided

Requirements Defined:

BID BONDS:

Troy University Purchasing Policy provides that all vendors are required to furnish a bid bond on any contracts for services **exceeding \$50,000**. A bid bond is designed to secure a particular bid until it is either rejected or accepted and a contract is made and secured or goods are received. Bid guarantees may be presented in the form of a bid bond, postal money order, certified check, cashier's check or irrevocable letter of credit for no less than 10% of the bid amount. All check guarantees for unsuccessful bidders will be returned in a timely manner.

For the successful bidder, a bid bond remains in effect until the following:

1. A vendor who is providing goods or materials has received an approved Troy University Purchase Order or contract, or
2. A vendor who is providing services has been notified of award. The bid bond for the successful vendor will remain in the possession of the Troy University Purchasing Department until such time as a performance bond can be presented to the University for services under contract.

PERFORMANCE BONDS:

TROY University provides that a bond in a responsible sum for faithful performance of the contract, with adequate surety, shall be required in an amount specified in the advertisement for bids. The performance bond shall be set at no less than 10% of the total contractual amount or at a stated amount of no less than the cost of one month's service, whichever is greater. A performance bond must be in effect prior to the first date of service. Upon award of the bid, the **awarded** bidder will be responsible for providing a Performance Bond which should be valid until all work associated with this project has been completed. Performance bonds may be presented in the form of a surety bond (PREFERRED), postal money order, certified check, or cashier's check. The performance bond should be presented to Troy University Purchasing Department before a purchase order is issued. No goods are to be delivered and no work is to begin without an official Troy University purchase order.

VENDOR DISCLOSURE FORMS:

State of Alabama Act 2001-955 requires that the Vendor Disclosure statement be completed and filed with all proposals, bids, contracts or grant proposals to the State of Alabama in excess of \$5,000.00. Vendor Disclosure Statement Information and Instructions

Pursuant to Act 2001-955, any person who knowingly provides misleading or incorrect information on the disclosure statement shall be subject to a civil penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of the transaction, not to exceed \$10,000.00. Also, the contract or grant shall be voidable by the awarding entity.

Definitions as Provided in Act 2001-955

Family Member of a Public Employee - The spouse or a dependent of the public employee.

Family Member of a Public Official - The spouse, a dependent, an adult child and his or her spouse, a parent, a spouse's parents, a sibling and his or her spouse, of the public official.

Family Relationship - A person has a family relationship with a public official or public employee if the person is a family member of the public official or public employee.

Person - An individual, firm, partnership, association, joint venture, cooperative, or corporation, or any other group or combination acting in concert.

Public Official and Public Employee - These terms shall have the same meanings ascribed to them in Sections 36-25-1(23) and 36-25-1(24), Code of Alabama 1975, (see below) except for the purposes of the disclosure requirements of this act, the terms shall only include persons in a position to influence the awarding of a grant or contract who are affiliated with the awarding entity. Notwithstanding the foregoing, these terms shall also include the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, members of the cabinet of the Governor, and members of the Legislature.

Section 36-25-1(23), Code of Alabama 1975, defines a public employee as any person employed at the state, county or municipal level of government or their instrumentalities, including governmental corporations and authorities, but excluding employees of hospitals or other health care corporations including contract employees of those hospitals or other health care corporations, who is paid in whole or in part from state, county, or municipal funds. For purposes of this chapter, a public employee does not include a person employed on a part-time basis whose employment is limited to providing professional services other than lobbying, the compensation for which constitutes less than 50 percent of the part-time employee's income.

Section 36-25-1(24), Code of Alabama 1975, defines a public official as any person elected to public office, whether or not that person has taken office, by the vote of the people at state, county, or municipal level of government or their instrumentalities, including governmental corporations, and any person appointed to a position at the state, county, or municipal level of government or their instrumentalities, including governmental corporations. For purposes of this chapter, a public official includes the chairs and vice-chairs or the equivalent offices of each state political party as defined in Section 17-16-2, Code of Alabama 1975.
