

The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the Senior Student Survey in spring 2018. The purpose of this survey is to identify student satisfaction of students that would graduate fall 2017, T1, T2 or T3, with their experiences at Troy University, recognize student development as a result of their Troy University education, and identify areas that need to be improved. Data collected in this survey are used to help the University strengthen its academic programs, better serve the needs of its students, and become more effective and efficient in accomplishing its mission and goals. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 4,841 students. The target population was students who would graduate during the fall semester 2017, T1, T2 or T3. After two follow up emails on April 18, 2018 and April 26, 2018, a total of 979 responses were received; representing a 20% response rate




From which Troy University campus will you graduate?

I had some really good instructors but I had some horrible ones too. I had some that clearly did not want to teach and provided the smallest amount of assignments causing me to feel like I am not earning a degree. Then you have some that provide SO much work it's hard to pay attention to your other classes. And I mean A LOT of work. Some of these instructors are rude when you ask for clarification on their expectations since they do not provide thorough expectations on their assignments and discussion boards. The only things I was always clear on was the tests since they speak for themselves. Will I come back to Troy? Yes, because it's the only college I know and feel familiar with. I have heard about other schools being too easy or having issues getting in and I don't have time for that.

Everything was great until my last term. That is when I discovered the open door policy was a joke and the faculty did not care. We are a number that resembles tuition. No one really cares when a Professor fails to communicate, post grades, or interact at all, let alone in a timely manner. I watched my grades post then change days later to a lower grade with no explanation. Email the Professor and ask??? No response from her or the Doctor who supposedly took over. How professional and transparent!! In the last 3 years, my love and pride for Troy grew each and every term. Through the struggles and the triumphs, I pushed and pulled through. Troy ruined that in 6 weeks. Congratulations.

I think the biggest problem with my experience was simply my degree choice. I chose to go to college for an English Degree with the eventual goal of teaching. While had I went through with that plan it would have been an effective plan I ended up with a job in engineering while attending college, and now my degree will only be partially used to me. I still learned critical thinking and analytic skills so I'm not disappointed with the knowledge I gained, however, my return on investment will fall significantly short.

It was a pleasure and honor to be a non-traditional student here at Troy.

In the education program, we participated in edTPA during internship to be certified nationally upon passing scores. I am so grateful that Mrs. Carter and Mrs. Walters dedicated their time and resources to assist usv in one of the most challenging task ever. Without their support I would have not been able to complete this task. However, I recommend a new alternaltive to completing edTPA after internship.

I had a great experience attending school at Troy. Though I was an online student, I had no trouble accessing resources that I needed. In particular, Dr. Valkyrie has been a huge help in my education and in preparing for the doctorate program I am applying to.

The Psychology Program is an excellent program. I think the out of state students should be given the same opportunity to receive the same financial assistance as the students in state.

I really enjoyed my Exercise Science: Pre-Health program because of Dr. Garner and Dr. Green. They are wonderful assets to Troy University and I wish I could take both of them with me to graduate school. I feel prepared for my future thanks to them.

Mandated survey's have zero impact on change within the institution. The tuition, fees, and books cost paid during the four years of school will never be covered in a a graduates new job in the field. How can a 50K per year job provide a return on the investment? The information provided in the courses are completely out dated and not relevant to the job.

I am studying social work, and for Troy to allow an Association of Black Social Workers to be created, absolutely floors me. If Troy truly understood and honored the NASW code of ethics, they would not have allowed the creation of such a group. It honestly makes me question if I even want a degree from a school that allows for such discrimination. In the social work career field, exclusion and discrimination is part of what we work against, and that "association" just completely supports what we're supposed to be trying to solve.

Veteran's services should have a phone number not just a email address.

I would like to reiterate the excellence of my advisors, both Junior year and Senior year. I also want to take the time to let you know that although the majority of my professors were excellent, two fell far short of your standards. First, let me tell you that I am very self-motivated and I hold myself to a high standard, I have earned all 'A's in my major field of study, Psychology. I took two classes that were so poorly taught that I made the decision not to finish them, which was a first for me. I tried contacting both professors and with the Statistics prof. I was curtly told to read the book on several occasions. With the research (history) class the professor would not answer questions either, stating that she did not want to do the work for me, which I never asked to do. I was seeking clarification. I did discuss these things with my advisor and sent her a copy of all communications with these professors. I would never wish either of these professors on any other student I refused to let both these experiences keep me from my goal. I met and have become close to several classmates and professors. So, thank you Troy University for an amazing learning experience.

Financial Aid department is inconsistent with practices. I was awarded a certain amount of financial aid at the beginning of the semester, then the offer was retracted when I went to apply for more of my loan. Leaving me in a financial bind and possibly delaying my graduating. Additionally, when enrolled in summer courses I was told that I would not get kicked out of my fall courses if summer is not paid on time, since I was already registered for fall. I was kicked out of my Fall courses, and financial aid did not give an apology or fix the situation, just simply stated "we are not sure why XX employee told you that."

Part of the Troy University experience is being surrounded by a beautiful environment. It is important for the environment to be maintained for face and for the experience of those who are on campus.

There is too much emphasis on this aspect. There is not enough concern for how the students and faculty are affected by the constant need to prune the campus and the refusal to build parking garages or make it easier for students to access ALL parts of campus quickly. Just because a student does not possess a handicap tag does not mean that the student is able to get across campus quickly or at all. Just because a parking lot is built on one side of campus does not mean that the parking dilemma is remedied. 
There needs to be more done for the functionality of the campus, and less for the appearance. The faculty and students should be provided for more so that the want of the higher ups.




