

The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the Senior Student Survey in spring 2019. The purpose of this survey is to identify student satisfaction of students that would graduate fall 2018, T1, T2 or T3, with their experiences at Troy University, recognize student development as a result of their Troy University education, and identify areas that need to be improved. Data collected in this survey are used to help the University strengthen its academic programs, better serve the needs of its students, and become more effective and efficient in accomplishing its mission and goals. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 4,595 students. The target population was students who would graduate during the fall semester 2018, T1, T2 or T3. After two follow up emails on April 18, 2019 and May 6, 2019, a total of 943 responses were received; representing a 20.5% response rate


From which Troy University campus will you graduate?

I am a seasoned individual who decided to return to college to complete my educational experience I began over forty years ago. Needless to say, it was an adventure and a true experience I will never forget. Technology is amazing for me as a Baby Boomer. I enjoyed interacting with the many young people I met along the way. Troy offered me a much smaller size classroom which made me feel comfortable and less intimidating. I felt as though Troy University was truly a school built around "family". The only issue I had while attending Troy online is regarding graduation. I don't remember receiving an email with the dates I needed to apply by. Even though I'm not walking I have to wait for another term before receiving my diploma.

My overall experience at Troy has been good. There were a couple of things that bothered me, but what bothered me the most was the level of academic advisement. I requested advisement on more than one occasion, and what I received was inadequate in my opinion. The result of my advisement caused a significant delay in my graduation date. Recommendations for finance or financial economics curriculum:

- The curriculum should have included some sort of tax course. Not necessarily the same tax courses that accounting students take but a course that did a better job relating finance to tax. Like teaching nifty ways to deffer taxes by using derivatives or stacking interest maturities for the best outcome from a tax standpoint. Super duper important stuff in the real world I think, but all in all the curriculum was good and very challenging.

During my college years, I became lost and in a very hard place. Many people I have met experienced this as well. The difference for me was I actually had faculty and administration who truly cared about me. Dr. Gregory Davis was one of those professors. In the years I have attended Troy University, I have grown to have both positive and negative feelings towards the organization as a whole. I feel that a lack of communication between departments on campus is evident. One department might say a process must be completed in a certain way and another department might tell you otherwise. When it comes to registering for classes each department seems to have different procedures. Some may require you to come into the office by first setting up an appointment where others may allow you to register remotely. Some programs even liable you as "high risk" and require you to make every decision regarding your education through supervision. I feel that this is degrading to the individual and the difference between processes can become unfair and frustrating to students.

On a brighter side, I have seen the athletic departments development into a thriving part of Troy and I can say "I am a Trojan" with pride. Many of the upgraded facilities provide for a positive environment to surround yourself in. I see this school becoming even better than it already is, but the procedural side of the school is still lacking. I feel that this could be an easy problem to fix and transition over the next few years. I hope to see improvements and have faith in the administration. Paige F. Paquette, and Ms. Judy Robertson. I am very thankful to all these ladies and all their help during my time at Troy University.




