

The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the New Student Survey in spring 2020. (Year of COVID) The purpose of the survey was to identify the satisfaction of the fall 2019, T1,T2 and T3 new students with their experiences at Troy University and to determine how well the University served their needs as new undergraduate students. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 4,053 students. The target population was the new students who enrolled at the University for the first time during the fall semester, T1, T2 and T3 in 2019. After two follow up emails, on April 28, 2020 and May 14, 2020, a total of 728 responses were received; representing a 11.5% response rate.





Any questions I have had through my process of enrolling were always answered in a friendly and timely manner!

I emailed my advisor aboutsigning up for T4 and she answered one email and not the rest. I can't even tell you her name. I had to call and speak to someone else and they helped me sign up for my T4 classes.

Very understanding.

My academic advisor was not as helpful as I had thought or expected and I had often went to other advisors for help. During my first semester, I had no idea who my advisor was, and when I did I often did not get a chance to meet or speak with them about any issues I had scheduling. The one time or few times the second semester that I was able to, it was around lunch break, and when I had asked for easier classes for my gpa, I was stuck with harder ones or early morning ones as options. Biology was also not my strong suit class, yet I had perferred it over chemistry. I did not want to take biology, and most of the classes that I took had nothing to do with my major. My advisor said that I had to retake biology because I did not pass it in high school, which did not make any sense and I did not have to take it last year. As well as world history, I had passed world history in high school and said that I needed it for my gpa/ major, which did not make any sense. I had already taken world and American History, which felt like a dozen times in high school, and passed and did not want to take again because it is a long lecture class. There was one class that did have to do with my major, but I had to drop it as well as history because it was a hard lecture class with only 5 tests to fix your grade. Which, did not help me with my situation. On. top of that, I had already signed up for the classes that I had wanted, but I did not figure out till a few days later, my advisor said, btw, I forgot to click the register now button. Which was a tiny, little button, in which I did not see, in the top left or right corner. So, I had to reschedule for the last minute classes and not go to economics class or Kirby's math class, or any of the others that I had originally had signed up for, and was attending for the past few days before this last little mention. On top of that, when I had registered to remove some of my classes due to the crisis, I had originally scheduled to remove these classes days before the deadline, in which you can do it. My advisor did not follow me up on that. When I had emailed to tell my advisor about it again, they said that it was too late for me to remove classes, as I had reminded them after the deadline. So I had went back, and told my advisor that I had asked in an email prior to the deadline to remove these 2 classes, and sent an attachment of the first email. Then my advisor tried to fix the mistake.

My current advisor is polite and answers my questions or helps me when I need, but she is definitely not the proactive type. When she took over my student account, there were some hiccups and slow goings that I think could have got me started at Troy sooner if she would have been a little more on the ball. Additionally, I don't know if she actually looks at my student file/transcripts when I seek advice, because she has recommended classes or given advice on things that I have already completed.

I would also like to note that this is the second or third advisor that has been assigned to me.

On a positive note, I would really like to say that in my initial intake process and with various items I needed help with admissions and registration, Matt Williams was so helpful and wonderful!


