

The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the New Student Survey in spring 2021. The purpose of the survey was to identify the satisfaction of the fall 2020, T1,T2 and T3 new students with their experiences at Troy University and to determine how well the University served their needs as new undergraduate students. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 4,436 students. The target population was the new students who enrolled at the University for the first time during the fall semester, T1, T2 and T3 in 2021. After two follow up emails, on April 26, 2021 and May 10, 2021, a total of 331 responses were received; representing a 7.5% response rate.






Which Troy University campus are you currently enrolled?





The transfer process for me has been horrible. It is less of the fault of my academic advisor although I would have appreciated more help on her end. Transferring over I have one last art history class to take at my community college. I had originally thought my art history class would transfer as art history requirement which it hasn't. A lot of my classes didn't transfer over as much as I thought they would. Now because I can't get the transcript until the end of May I can't take summer classes. It has put me soooo far behind and I would have never chosen Troy honestly if I knew it would be like this. I have had way to many full blown crying sessions over this. So now I am going into another term where apparently I can't even take any classes which is so frustrating and I just don't feel like I have any sense of direction.

My advisor is really cool. He helps me a lot when it comes to plan my courses. He is very helpful and kind.

My advisor has been extremely helpful during my first semester at Troy. He has responded promptly, either sameday or beginning of day.

I've had a great first year at Troy and I am grateful to my academic counselor.

My advisor is extremely helpful!

I felt my first advisor did not take the time to notice what requirements I actually needed. I emailed my first advisor and included my student ID at the top of the email, like what was told in auto-generate emails, and asked her a question about what classes to take next. In her response she reminded me to include my student ID in my email, and then recommended classes I already has credits for. I felt as if she had a sheet of classes she normally recommends and just copied and pasted it without looking into what was needed specifically for me as a student. I have ended up not even contacting her since and figuring out my requirements and taking the classes provided to me in the self service portal. I now have a new advisor, and have not contacted them yet. I hope this new advisor is able to help me as I am soon transitioning from my general education classes to my program for my major.

I contacted the academic advisor and head of department before enrolling to determine whether pursuing a BS or jumping into an MS was more appropriate for the change in field I'm attempting. They were both extremely helpful, friendly, and encouraging.

I think it would be helpful to have a department advisor for incoming freshmen who have decided on a major and who have dual enrollment credit form high school.

Give students advisors that go along with their program of choice stop giving them to advisors that do not anything about their program of choice.

My academic advisor changed during the term, leaving me a bit lost. I will be contacting her replacements soon, so I don't know yet if they will be as helpful.

The availability of contact with my academic advisor is greatly appreciated. Being able to contact them over the phone and with e-mail helps if I have any questions or concerns.

I am in the Hospitality Management program, and have worked in the hospitality career field for 24 years in jobs ranging from entry-level, supervisor, and manager. The degree program requires an internship for an entry-level position within the hospitality career field. Why is this required when I have documentation proving my experience? And then there's the fact that I am married, supporting a family. Am I expected to quit my job just to do an internship that pays less than what I currently make? I think there should be some adjustments to the policy for persons with real life experience (that is documented). I did contact my Academic Advisor/Associate, and I communicated with the head of the Hospitality Department. It should not matter what I do with my degree in regards to the workforce after graduation. The internship should be optional credits for those who want to get experience, not a requirement for those who already have experience.

I was not able to get in contact with my advisor. I emailed serval times and never got a response from her. I was left one on may one to figure what classes to take. I reached out to Professor Ricciardelli who was kind enough to help me navigate through the advising process and meet with me in person.

The statements above apply to the freshman advisors I have had contact with through the JWS center. I am part of an honors program through the Sorrell College of Business, and have noticed a severe lack of understanding of the program's requirements by the JWS advisors, leading to confusion and difficulty regarding the classes I needed to plan and register for.

I have recently had Dr Clint Relyea from the college of business added to my team of advisors, who is one of the directors of my honors program. None of these statements are referring to Dr Relyea, as he has guided me with the utmost care from the very beginning of my time at Troy even before he was assigned as one of my advisors. Without Dr Relyea's guidance I would not have been informed enough to take the classes required for my program, as the JWS center advisors have not been trained in our program's requirements.



My last thing that I have struggled with as a Troy Student is ProctorU. I actually wrote about it in one of my classes and will post what I wrote below:

A product that continually annoys me is ProctorU. ProctorU although not a tangible product is a service used for students to take tests through a proctoring system. My issue with ProctorU is how unreliable it is. I have used this product multiple times since transferring and have every single time had an issue with it on my computer. I have tried different browser extensions as well as testing it ahead of time. Without a doubt it never actually works the time I need to take a test. Therefore I spend usually 20-60 minutes with a representative who struggles helping me with my situation. One of the best responses being "get a different computer". If only I had the money to do that. On top of that I feel the price is completely unreasonable for students who have no other option when taking online classes.

Although I do understand that for taking these tests they do need to make sure our browsers are clear there was one instance when I took a test and it deleted a lot of information from my computer including my background desktop images as well as any saved passwords for any sites. That was a fun one to rectify for the next few weeks. I would love for developers to go through all of these kinks so that when someone needs to take a test it is as simple as taking the test and just blocking other browsers. It is nice that they have live representatives however if things ran smoothly to begin with they wouldn't be necessary.

I don't think these needs are met because it is hard to accomodate many different individuals with many different computer systems, browsers, and web extensions. There are also not enough representatives who know how the site well enough to help students through issues when they have them which I believe is due to lack of training which probably occurs because of the expense it takes to train representatives.

I think that developers definitely deliberately ignored these needs. The ratings for this site are 1.1 with 279 reviews which is pretty horrible. As well as they have me fill out a survey at times to see how my experience was. Even with every survey I have filled out I have never heard back from their customer service team nor seen any improvement. This shows that these developers are deliberately ignoring these needs. I am unsure why they deliberately ignore these needs, but they probably have something themselves to gain. It is extremely smart how it is set up because no matter what students have to use this service to take tests to pass their classes. This gives a great opportunity for them to set a high price because us students have no other option. On top of that the service itself doesn't even have to be very good since students are required to use this site and left with no other option.

It causes a lot of stress on me and I assume many other consumers. This unnecessary stress especially right before a test doesn't help with performance. I don't know how many other students have this issue, but based on reviews I know I am not the only one. It harms the reputation for ProctorU as well as the institutions who use it.

I have been thoroughly advised regarding my academics and schedule in order for me to pursue my degree. The overall staff as a whole works in a unified manner. By everyone working together it helps build my confidence in a friendly and safe environment. I am grateful that the Lord has given me an opportunity to go Troy University. My husband and family are my biggest supporters.

I can't say enough good things about Troy. I have several friends who have participated in the nursing programs who suggested I try Troy and I love it here. The extra care that goes into making sure students succeed is not lost on me!!

I do not know if all institutions work this way, but I may research in order to maybe transfer.

Even with the time difference and the pandemic, my advisors have superceded those I had at Penn State during my years there. I genuinely feel heard and cared about by the staff and my teachers have all been responsive and engaging. I could not be more thankful for my Troy University experience so far.

Overall I have enjoyed my experience. This is not my first degree, but my first time taking online courses. So far only one of the instructors has been engaging with the students. The rest of the classes have have a been a self-learn setup. I feel I am paying an expense just to take exams that cover the material. The online instructors should engage with the students more. A simple lecture for each chapter covering the material would be a step in the right direction.

I came across a RUDE man named Matthew on the 5th floor. He is rude and unprofessional. He has a attiude problem. And told me it was gone be extra work on him when I told him I wanted to request a new advisor. Who does that?

I told him my complaint and he flipped it on me saying my communication is bad. He makes Troy look even worst!!!!
