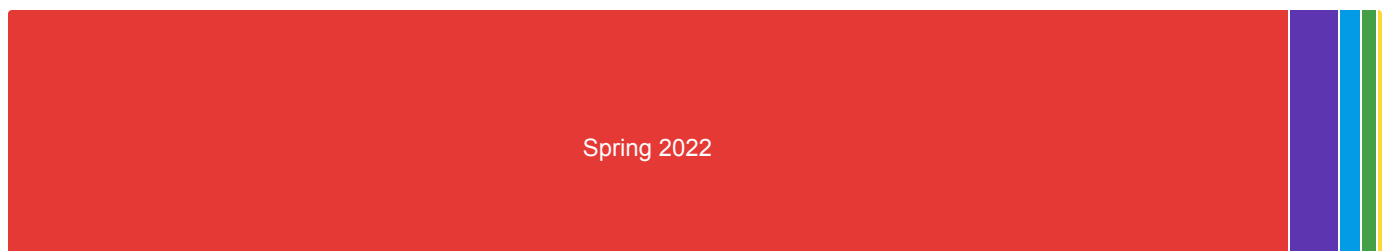


2021 Senior Student Survey Report

The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the Senior Student Survey in spring 2021. The purpose of this survey is to identify student satisfaction of students that would graduate fall 2020, T1, T2 or T3, with their experiences at Troy University, recognize student development as a result of their Troy University education, and identify areas that need to be improved. Data collected in this survey are used to help the University strengthen its academic programs, better serve the needs of its students, and become more effective and efficient in accomplishing its mission and goals. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 1,675 students. The target population was students who would graduate during the fall semester 2020, T1, T2 or T3. After two follow up emails on April 26, 2021 and May 10, 2021, a total of 356 responses were received; representing a 21% response rate.

From which Troy University campus will you graduate?

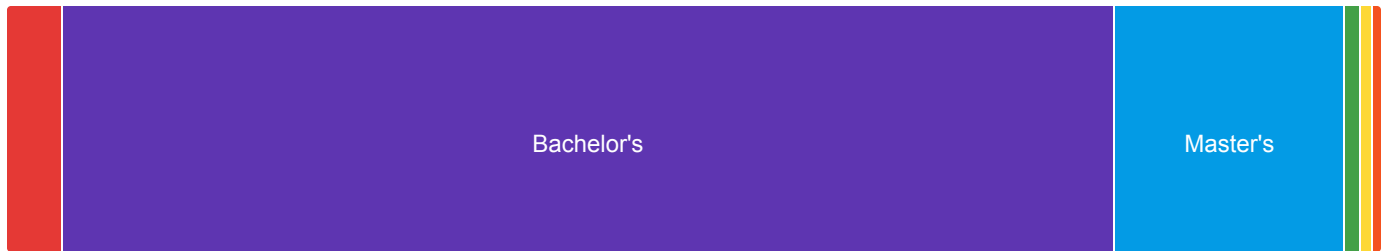

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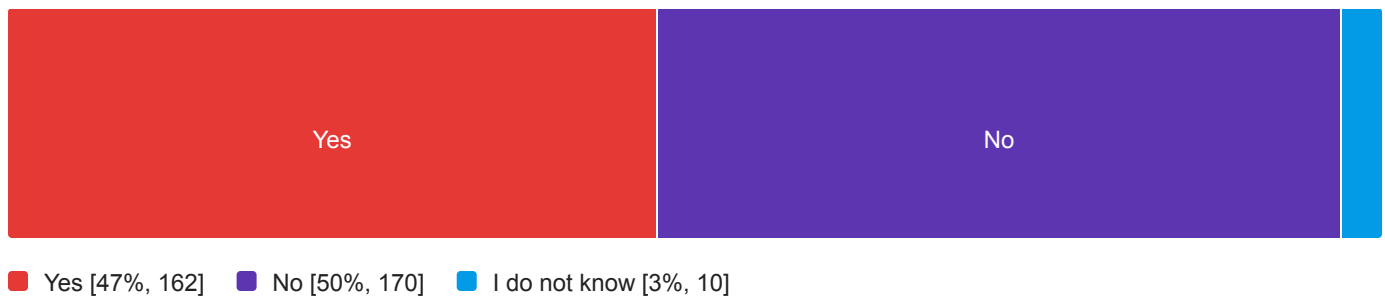
How long have you attended Troy University?



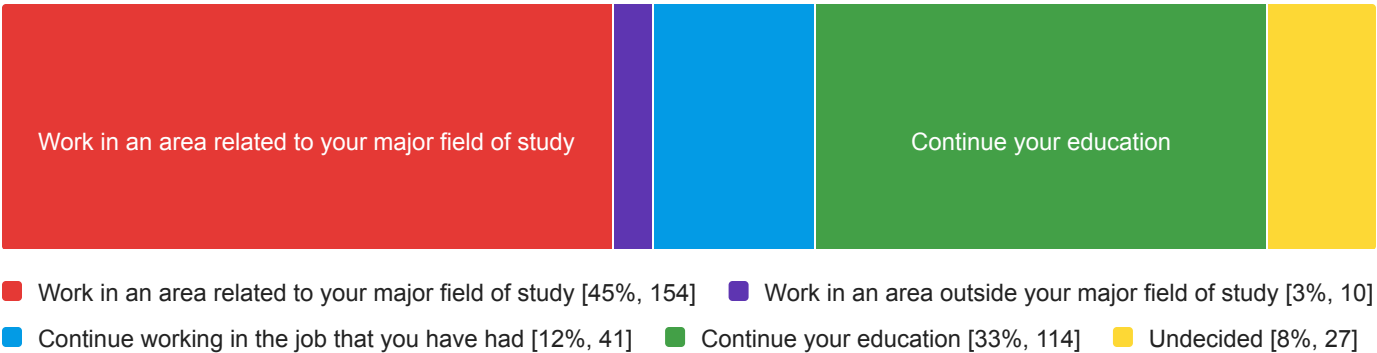
What is your overall GPA?



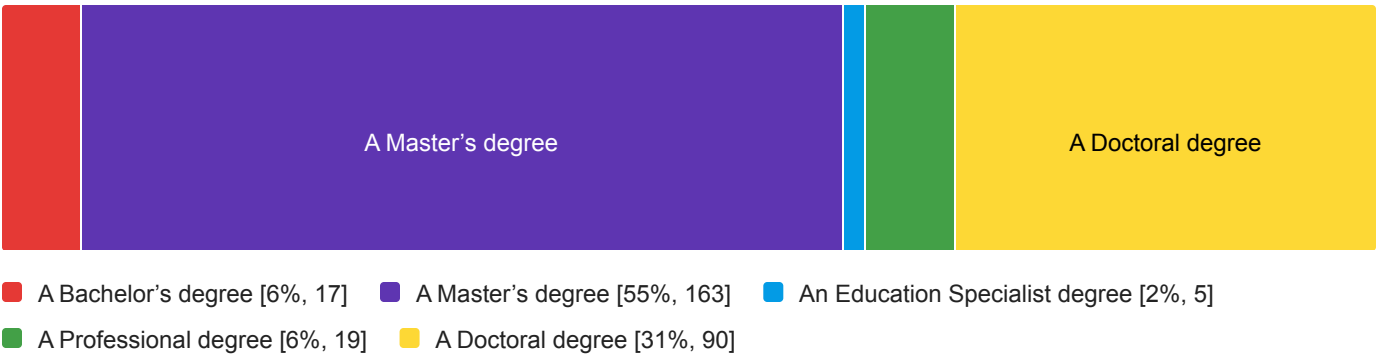

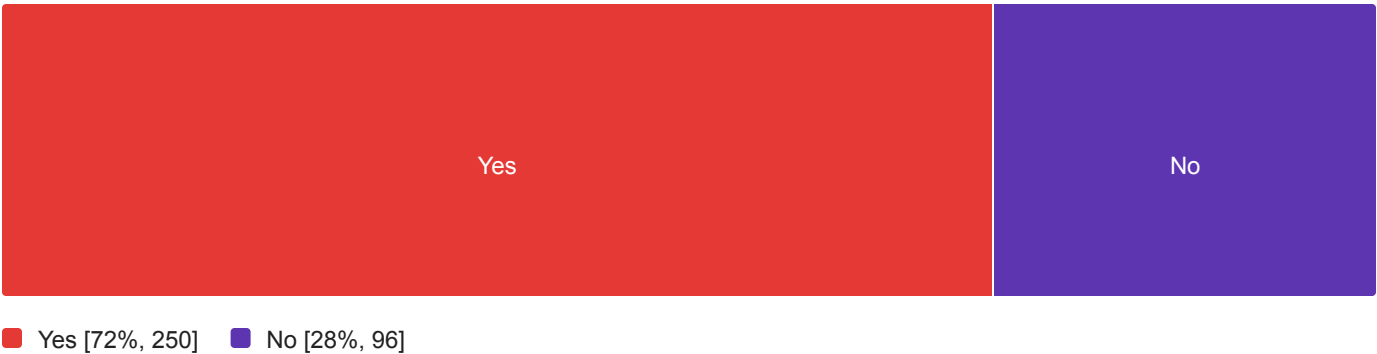

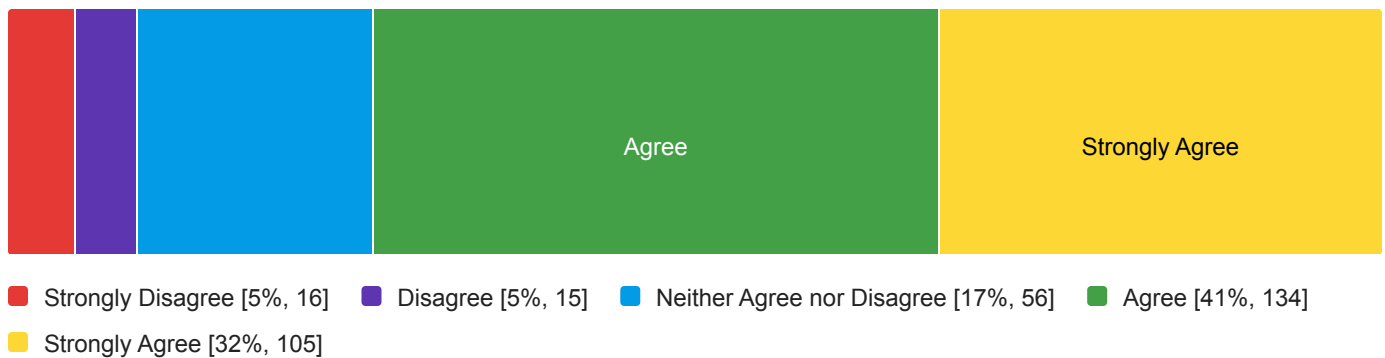

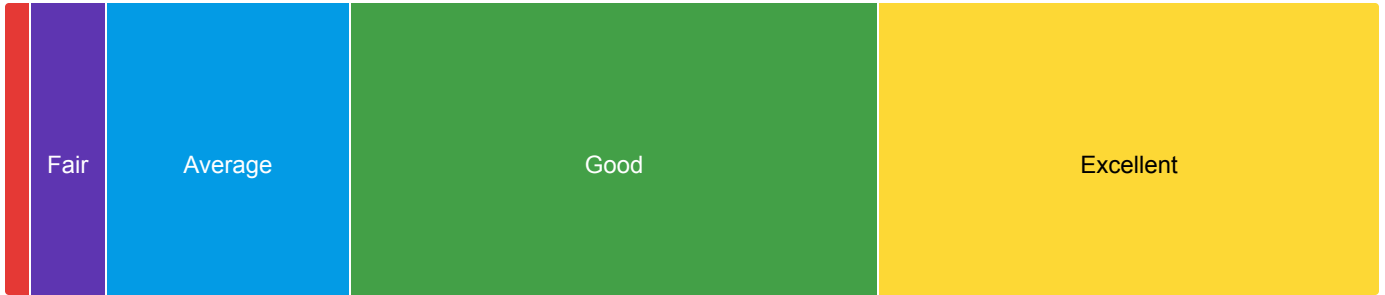

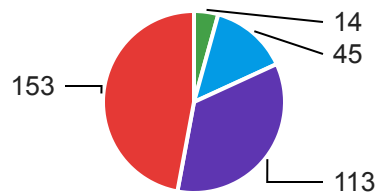

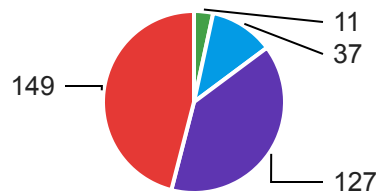

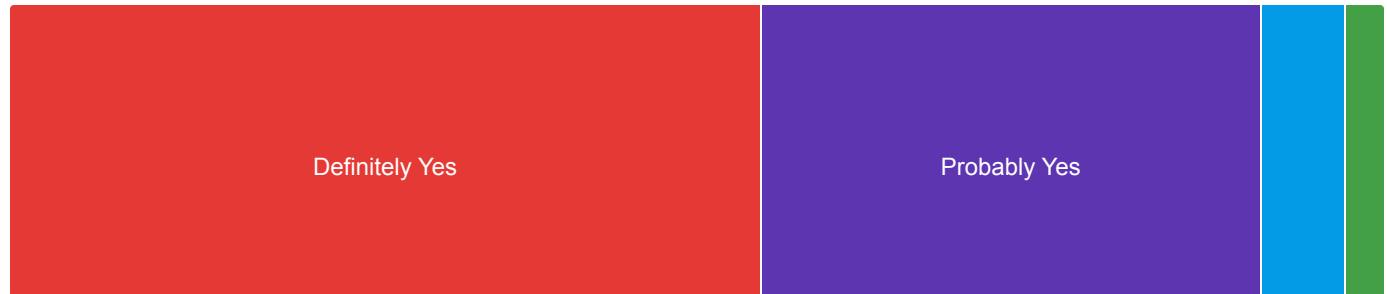

Troy was the best choice for me because of its size and opportunities to be involved on campus. Only regret is it passed by so quickly!

Requiring a minor is stupid and costly. I wanted a Bachelor's degree, nothing more.

My minor included a course I took with my Anthropology major, so I thought I wouldn't have to take an additional course, save 1000+ dollars. Nope, I had to substitute with something else. The only reason I chose the minor was the save that 1000+, complete waste of my time and family's resources.

Universities should work with students until they are employed at a decent job. This might be the only major "investment," of this nature, where you get no guarantee, warranty, or possibility for refund to go with it.

I have a lot of other complaints, but it wouldn't be fair to hurl them here as they are general complaints regarding college and University in general.

Troy University as a whole does not have adequate safety measures around campus for it's students. The Troy University Police are great, and are concerned about the safety of the students as individuals on campus. The problem* unfolds when the legal/security issue goes past the University Police and must go on to the Dean of student services (Herbert Reeves) and up. There have been many situations where, on campus, there has been a dangerous individual with ill intent towards other students (became legal, off campus, leading to court hearings and arrests, and even restraining orders). In these situations where MANY students were at risk of or experiencing: being harmed, threatened (verbally or physically), or stalked, it was clear that the academic and student services staff of Troy University were far more concerned with financial matters (fear of losing a student's tuition) over the safety of their students (as a whole, being, the ones in immediate or at risk of danger). This problem needs to be addressed with Chancellor Jack Hawkins, his wife, Janice Hawkins, and Dean Reeves, as well as the University Police. I would say that the campus police could tell about their experiences in this area, but I believe it would be hard to without getting backlash from the leaders of the university.

The ASN program at Troy Montgomery needs internal review and improvements in communication between faculty members to ensure a smooth transition from class to class. It is all a mess with inconsistencies between instructors as well as between what is said in lecture and what is presented in text. More effort needs to be given by all faculty to create more of an organized program than a cluster of classes with no real organization as a whole. It is mass chaos.

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I did not love the commencement ceremony. I feel like Troy University is one that prides itself on having a diverse population, yet they picked a speaker that would only be favorable to a certain group of people. I feel as though there has to be several alumni from the university that have gone on to achieve many things that are not a religious leader of a controversial church, that may have been a better selection as a speaker. If we were a private Christian school than this speaker would have made sense, but I feel like for a "diverse" public university it was not appropriate. There was also only 1 female on the stage and only 2 people of color. I just feel like if your going to claim a diverse university the board of trustees ,and the graduation stage, should represent that. I also feel like there ceremony wasn't well planned out as far as us all walking out together, we turned our tassels at the beginning instead of the end, we weren't able to throw our caps, and they didn't announce which college we graduated from. Then as the end the Board of Trustees walked out and that was it there was no congratulations Class of 2021. Maybe moving forward they should do a practice with the graduates before the ceremony.

ITP program is a mess, professors did not give a lot of feedback, some teachers violated ADA accommodations forcing me to take classes without reasonable accomodations,

It seems clear that the two departments that are prioritized in helping students continue education or pursue career are Business and Education. I felt like other programs, including mine, did not have near the resources that those two did to help me continue after graduation. Troy did a very poor job of helping me with my scholarship when I started at the school. I talked to dozens of people and kept getting transferred, and when I finally was able to talk to someone who could do something, she was very upset something had not been done sooner, but by then it was too late. I had major issues with a couple of professors and the protocol as to how to handle it did not accomplish anything. Two professors left scars on my transcript because they did not see it right to graduate with a 4.0 as I was, and the school had no answer for this. These two professors were anomalies. They were the only professors that did not genuinely care for my success, but it was enough to leave a bad taste in my mouth. I'm considering obtaining my masters, but it is hard to keep Troy as a consideration with situations like that not being taken care of. I love Troy. I love a lot of things about Troy. But there are some problems that should not be problems.

Great environment that I was able to learn a lot from in hopes to helping the community as well as expanding my options for my career path.

I was glad to attend a university that wasn't politically motivated. All ideas and opinions were expressed. Professors were opened minded and not like the stories we hear from others on the news. I really enjoyed my time here!

The ASN program at the Montgomery campus needs work. Part of the instructors are excellent teachers & want to help you as a student & see you succeed. The remaining are ineffective lecturers and/or don't care about your growth as a student & act as if they are too busy to help, brush off your concerns, & downright intimidating to point of actual bullying. Especially directed at those of us who had to work simultaneously because if forced to chose between employment & education, employment would be the mandatory option. Also, there were multiple occasions in which I (as well as other students) arrived at the lab to learn a new skill vital for our chosen field, only to be told to "pretend". These skills included tasks such as initiating intravenous access, insertion & removal of urinary catheters, & sterile dressing changes. As a student who paid specific funds allocated to laboratory fees, I expect to be provided the appropriate supplies necessary for learning a procedures I will be performing on a human being. I was very disappointed at the lack of empathy & compassion amongst some instructors, particularly in a field who's basis is the caretaking of others, to be discouraging. I think those of us who continued our journey of pursuing a nursing degree through a pandemic, despite copious amounts of uncertainty & fear, should receive a bit more accommodation for the additional stress placed on us while running into the pandemic while everyone else was fleeing.

Career placement and post education planning would be extremely helpful. More attentive and communicative online faculty would be helpful. Clarification of capstone's conflicting guidelines would be helpful.

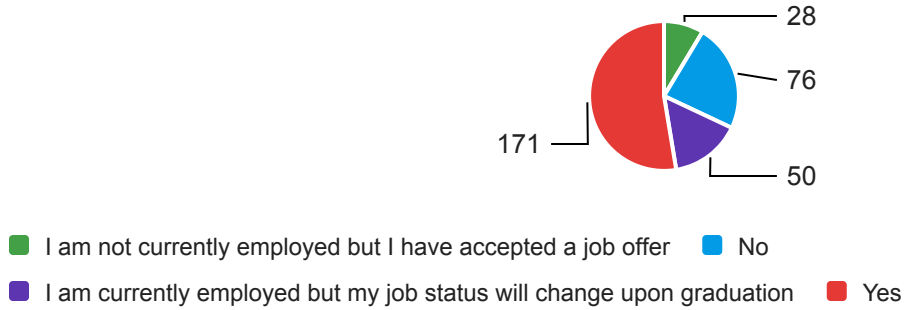

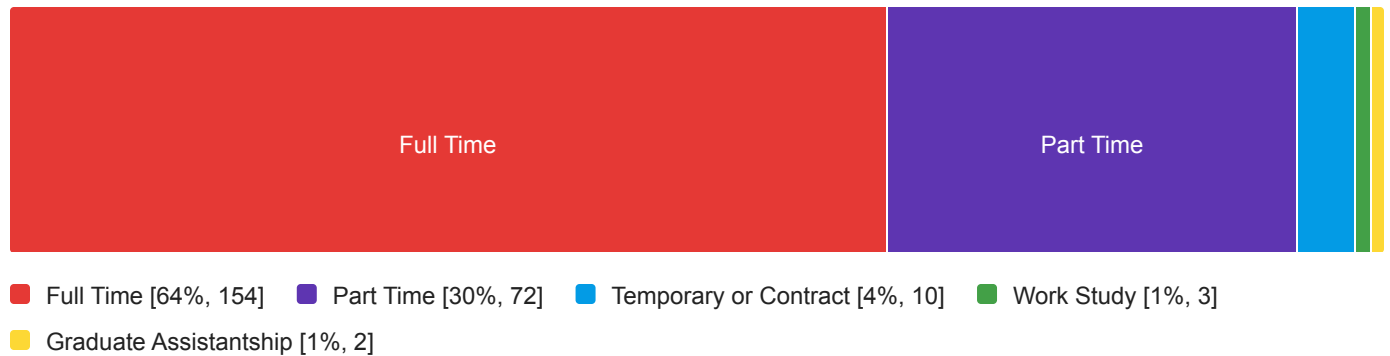
Will you be continuing your education through Troy University?



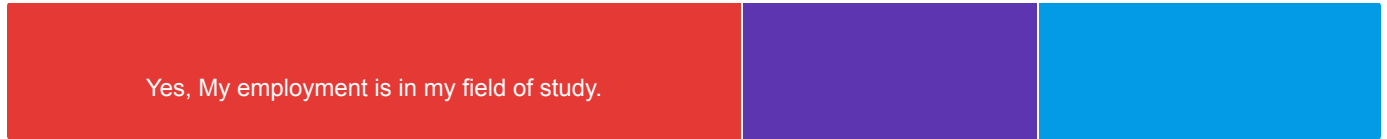
Are you currently employed?
