
The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the Senior Student Survey in spring 2023. The purpose of this survey is to identify student satisfaction of students that would graduate fall 2022, T1, T2 or T3, with their experiences at Troy University, recognize student development as a result of their Troy University education, and identify areas that need to be improved. Data collected in this survey are used to help the University strengthen its academic programs, better serve the needs of its students, and become more effective and efficient in accomplishing its mission and goals. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 1,292 students. The target population was students who would graduate during the fall semester 2022, T1, T2 or T3. After two follow up emails on April 20, 2023 and April 27, 2023, a total of 274 responses were received; representing a 21% response rate




From which Troy University campus will you graduate?





The elementary education program is phenomenal!

While I've gotten the training I need to work in my desired field, there was a lot of unneeded confusion and disorganized in the Interpreter Training Program. So much time was spent searching for information, usually with the result of getting different answers from different people. The logistics of the program are disorganized and unnecessarily complicated.

The Mental Health Counseling program at Troy University has been rewarding and enlightening. I have grown personally and professionally. Several of the academic professors at the university have challenged me to explore myself and reach my potential. Doctors Ickes, Crawford, and Riley have been instrumental in my development as a counseling professional. I am thankful that I was afforded the opportunity to learn from them. However, I must also state that it is imperative that the university implement courses and skill labs for students to gain a deeper understanding of counseling theories and concrete skills for the profession.

Stop cancelling classes people schedule for, just a week or two before they are supposed to be taken. This happened to me 3 separate times. If I schedule a course, I schedule it around when the Major requires it, and based on prerequisites as well as availability. When I schedule those courses, I do so under the belief that those courses are correctly identified as available when they say they are. However, numerous occasions I scheduled for courses and JUST before term starts, they're cancelled or 'no longer offered'. This hinders many students, not just myself, from being able to schedule and complete their major in a timely manner. Having to scramble to find replacement courses to be able to graduate, is not a good thing. I've taken 2 or so courses that I did not want to take, but had to based on major requirements (they were replacement-equivalent) and I had been prepared to take the courses I scheduled and registered for.

In the education department the students should but able to go to internship and get their degree without passing the praxis if they are not going to teach in Alabama. A state test sure not stop a students from getting a degree because they are paying for a higher education.

Other than the fact that there were certain classes that were not offered enough, there is only one other thing I would like to address. Some classes in my program taught some of the same material, and one class in particular was geared toward the lodging part of the degree program, and I have no interest in that part. I think that class was a waste in the long run, yet I still HAD to have it to graduate.

I wish more classes were often as far as electives. It would be fun to have a relevant class to our culture now, something fun and exciting where we still learn. But I loved my major and program it's so good it can only get better.

The field experience (CAFE) office needs to be more understanding and less rude. They need to show compassion and jot pick favorites. They would pray with one students and criticize another for the same thing. I don't like them picking favorites. Overall, they could do better.

Some classes didn't even feel like real college courses, and felt more like a joke than anything. Especially the Capstone courses!

The Leadership program at Troy is excellent!

- -The lab equipment needs updating
- -More simulations and critical thinking scenerios
- -Better clinical preceptors
- -Nursing should not have the highest fees/ tuition. We have to pay for travel to clinical and hotel lodging, \$300 access codes, and exam soft codes. We also should not have to pay thousands of dollars just to have a nice pinning ceremony.

More virtual (zoom, google meet) needs to be incorporated for more interactive teaching!!!!

I don't think computer concepts and applications was necessary in my degree completion. The first module was directed towards social media which I am not savvy with or required with my academic and professional standing. The rest of the class while beneficial to an extent does not pertain to law enforcement or security either. Basic manipulation of word is perhaps the only thing that mattered. Perhaps another elective which pertains to our studies will be more beneficial.


Well rounded program.


I'm grateful to have received a quality, full-time graduate level education through a majority-online format which allowed me to continue working and living remotely.




How would you rate Troy University's preparation of you for employment?




How would you rate Troy University's preparation of you for further education?




What is your overall rating of your college experiences at TROY?








Would you recommend your academic program to other students?

I wouldn't recommend my program because of all the disorganization and lack of communication. It creates a huge amount of unneeded stress during an already stressful time, particularly during the internship portion of the program.

Stop holding students from internships over a state test and a students degree over the same thing.

If you want to increase the amount of students attending Troy, or increase the quality of life for students here at Troy, decrease the influence 'Greek life' has on this university: promote SGA activities for non-frat/sorority students and make general students matter!

It does feel like some teachers grade unfairly.

Please reevaluate the parking permit costs (i.e. term tickets rather than 2 week tickets). After discussing with several people, more people would pay for 9 weeks at a time than every two weeks over and 9ver again. That is really the only complaint K have ever had with Troy.

The online program is highly underserved and lacks interaction. Books were asked off to purchase and we're not used. Curriculums at times we're updated and signing up for classes has been a big hassle

Please consider a better internal network of communication between staff, faculty, and the students. The professors I have had have been great and communicative to any concerns or questions, however, it seems the other faculty outside the department communicate poorly or not at all with each other, the students, and the departmental faculty/professors. I have sent emails, gone in person, and called non-departmental faculty and did not receive answers, or received conflicting information. I understand the faculty are busy, may not have an answer for every issue, or may not be aware of the ins-and-outs of Troy University, however, waiting three to four weeks for an email back is frustrating.

I emailed the Fraternity on the website when I started, but I did not receive any emails back. I would have loved to join.





Tuition is way over priced. If I were starting my education now, I simply would not go due to the cost and amount of debt I would accrue.




