
The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the New Student Survey in spring 2024. The purpose of the survey was to identify the satisfaction of the fall 2023, T1,T2 and T3 new students with their experiences at Troy University and to determine how well the University served their needs as new undergraduate students. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 3,960 students. The target population was the new students who enrolled at the University for the first time during the fall semester, T1, T2 and T3 in 2023. After two follow up emails, on April 23, 2024 and April 30, 2024, a total of 216 responses were received; representing a 5.5% response rate.


First-Generation Status: Did the parent(s) with whom you reside/resided receive a baccalaureate degree from a college or university?









I had one bad experience with a course that I eventually dropped. To me, the coursework was so heavy that my grades in my other courses fell tremendously because I was trying to keep up with that one course. All my other courses and Instructors have been good.

Classes are very new to me online, and I have been able to complete my assignments with ease.

Troy University is a fairly good campus and the communities created inside of many of my classes are really nice. That being said, the communities outside of the classroom are extremely sparing and aversive. There are a fair amount of clubs on campus, but I feel that none really appeal to me. My first year here was the most I have ever felt that I did not fit in and the most I have ever felt that I needed to fit in. Frankly, I'm disappointed in the lack of social events and clubs offered on campus. I've thought about transferring to universities that have more social opportunities routinely throughout my first year at Troy University, so I hope there is a larger focus on student clubs, organizations, and social events next fall semester. I'm also extremely disappointed in the tuition raises recently. I have also thought about transferring to different universities since I could get more for the same price. A driving factor for my attendance at Troy University was its affordability, but it seems that as time goes on that affordability diminishes exponentially. I'm also extremely disappointed in the fact that I will absolutely not be able to live on campus next year. I honestly expect what little social life there is on campus to be completely gone for me by next semester since it will be so unavailable. I hope that the student body feels the positive impact in the tuition raises by next semester in both facilities and social opportunity.

I am an older non-traditional student, so my perspective on attending college is different than that of a younger person.

The teachers here are a mixed bag. It seems to be a fifty-fifty split between those who love teaching and are passionate about their field and those who view teaching as more of a chore to get through than something they are obligated to do.

I've had several teachers that seem to regard teaching as some kind of torture they are forced to endure rather than their chosen field of vocation. I understand that some, if not most, of the faculty at the science building actually view their research work as their primary motivation for working here, but I would really rather not be viewed as a side hustle when I'm paying so much money to be here. Curriculums vary wildly between teachers teaching the same class, which is to be expected, but the lecture and lab segments of the same class being taught as if they are on different planets is a huge problem if you are interested in getting good grades in both. Teachers don't seem to really communicate with each other and you can get extremely different experiences in curriculum quality not just semester to semester, but class to class.

And the main issue is that teachers just don't seem to want to be here. I understand that, I really do, but if THEY don't want to be here, what should I be feeling? It really feels like I'm having to teach myself most basic concepts and when teachers are pressed for further information or resources they shut down and answer with some kind of vague affirmation that is designed to get you off of their back than reassure you. Additionally, more than half of these teachers have no idea how to use Canvas efficiently and the platform is just moot at this point. They don't enter grades at all, so you can't check your scores, inter-connectivity between Canvas and other platforms like Cengage or MindTap is fraught with errors, both teacher and platform-based, modules aren't used properly and are scattered to the four corners of the Earth so actually finding the appropriate information you need to pass the class and get a good grade is next to impossible.

Some teachers upload 300-slide PowerPoints to Canvas and expect you to be able to figure out which parts of it are the ones you need to focus on instead of streamlining the process and trimming it down to just the slides the class needs to focus on. Some teachers take literal months to grade basic assignments. Some don't reply to your emails. Some change the test content so that it doesn't match the study content. Some are just straight up unhelpful. A little more consistency would be very much welcome here.

Everyone is very nice but sometimes cannot answer questions I have or will refer me to other people who are also unsure which can make everything a bit stressful.
