Information Of A Legal Nature

The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) has filed a motion for reconsideration of a court order issued by U.S. District Judge Robert Varner with regard to a 1979 complaint filed against Troy State University.

A petition has been filed in circuit court concerning the policies regarding summer pay and teaching overloads and the administration of these policies. It has been requested that this petition be declared a class action on behalf of other members of the faculty.
