SPRING HONORS CONVOCATION RECOGNIZES OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUALS

Troy State University at Dothan hosted its fifth annual Spring Honors Convocation on May 8, 1992, at Calvary Baptist Church in Dothan. The Honors Convocation was initiated in 1988 to recognize outstanding students, faculty, staff, alumni, and community leaders associated with TSUD.

Dr. John Grimaldi, Plant Manager for Michelin Tire Corporation in Dothan, was the guest speaker.

Outstanding students from TSUD were recognized at the Honors Convocation. Each college/school presented the Dean's Award, Outstanding Student Award, and Student Service Award.

The Dean's Award is the highest award given within the school or college to both a graduate and undergraduate student in recognition of scholastic achievement, leadership and/or service to the University and community.

The Outstanding Student Award recognizes the most outstanding graduate and undergraduate student within each department in which a major is offered.

Student Service Awards recognizing outstanding service by a student to the school or college of the student's major were presented to students in the College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Education.

Dr. Frank Lovrich, Vice President for Academic Affairs at Troy State University at Dothan, recognized the recipients of the Outstanding Faculty Award during the 1992 Spring Honors Convocation.

The Outstanding Faculty Award recognizes one faculty member from each school or college who has made exemplary contributions in teaching, research, writing, and service to the University and community.

Receiving the faculty awards were Dr. Debra Ann King, outstanding faculty member from the School of Education; Dr.Richard Martin, outstanding faculty member from the College of Arts and Sciences; and Dr. Robert Long, outstanding faculty member from the School of Business.

Three outstanding adjunct faculty were recognized for exemplary teaching and service to Troy State University at Dothan.

The Outstanding Adjunct Faculty Award was presented to Mrs. Monika O'Quinn, Ozark, College of Arts and Sciences; Mr. Thomas Neese, Enterprise, School of Business; and Mrs. Shelia Bennett, Alford, FL, School of Education.

Two TSUD staff members were presented awards. Receiving the award for the Outstanding Classified Staff was Segrid Purvis, secretary for the School of Education. Tony Whetstone, Director of University Relations, was presented the award

for the Outstanding Professional Staff.

Ms. Beverly Youse, Executive Director of the House of Ruth, was the second recipient of the TSUD Outstanding Alumni Award. Ms. Youse earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from The Christopher Newport College of the College of William and Mary and her master's degree in counseling and psychology from TSUD.

Through Beverly's leadership, the House of Ruth has become a household name and its service area has expanded into Florida and Georgia. She routinely speaks to TSUD classes on domestic violence and supports many TSUD events by her presence and participation.

Ms. Youse has held the offices of secretary, president-elect, and president for the Alabama Coalition Against Domestic Violence. She is a member of the Statewide Task Force for Law Enforcement Training on Domestic Violence and serves as Legislative Chairperson for the Alabama Coalition Against Domestic Violence. She is a member of Alabama Association of University Women, Association of Service Agencies, and 1992 Class of Wiregrass Leadership.

Dave Shelman, SouthTrust Bank in Dothan, was the recipient of the Community Service Award. The Community Service Award is given in recognition of outstanding service to the University.

Mr. Shelman currently serves as chairman of the TSUD Continuing Education Advisory Council and as co-chairman of the TSUD Continuing Education Development Committee.

DR. PRISCILLA McARTHUR


Dr. Priscilla McArthur, associate professor of history at Troy State University at Dothan, has been recognized as the "Faculty of the Month" for the College of Arts and Sciences.

Dr. McArthur received her bachelor's degree from the University of Montevallo, her master's degree from Florida State University, and in 1976, earned her Ph.D. from Florida State University.

Prior to coming to TSUD in 1982, Dr. McArthur was an assistant professor at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock and was a researcher for the Arkansas Territorial Restoration (museum).

To her credit, she published a book entitled Arkansas in the Gold Rush, in 1986. Her latest endeavor involves planning a special trip this summer. She, along with her husband, Charles, will be touring Russia for two weeks and anticipates exposure to a variety of experiences pertinent to her Russian and European history classes.

Dr. McArthur and her husband reside in Dothan and have two sons: Mark and David.



DR. LEONARD ROBERTS

Dr. Leonard Roberts, associate professor of foundations of education at Troy State University at Dothan, has been recognized as the "Faculty of the Month" for the School of Education.

Dr. Roberts received his bachelor's degree from New York University, his master's degree from the University of Central Florida, an Ed.S. degree from the University of Florida, and in 1981, earned his Ph.D. in Foundations of Education from the University of Florida.

Prior to coming to TSUD in 1982, Dr. Roberts was an instructor at Lake City Community College in Lake City, Florida.

He is a member of the Correctional Education Association, Alabama Archaeological Society, and Phi Delta Kappa.

His publications include "Women's Emancipation Through

Education", Bringing Forth the Joys of Literacy, and Inmate Education in Florida's 19th Century Penal System: A Failure of Good Intention."

Dr. Roberts' most recent professional activities include a series of guest lectures at Chipola Junior College, where he was presented a certificate of award for "Advancing the Awareness of Women's History." He has also been awarded a grant to support the study of Pestalozzian Methodology in Early 19th Century America.

Mr. Forrest (Buzz) Wood, assistant professor and chairman of the computer and information sciences department at Troy State University at Dothan, has been recognized as the "Faculty of the Month" for the School of Business.

Mr. Wood received his bachelor's and master's degree from the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California. He received certification in data processing from the Institute for Certification of Computer Professionals and in 1985, completed his doctoral coursework in higher education from Nova University in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.

Prior to his employment at TSUD in 1976, Mr. Wood served twenty-five years in the U.S. Navy as a Naval Aviator. His naval service took him throughout the U.S. and Alaska, the Pacific Ocean, Viet Nam, and other sites in the Far East.

He is a member of the International Association for Computer Information Systems, America Mensa, Alabama Council on Computer Education, and serves as faculty advisor of the TSUD student chapter of the Wiregrass Data Processing Management Association.

Administrative Council

The TSUD Administrative Council met on May 8 in the Conference Room of Malone Hall. Dr. Harrison distributed and reviewed a 1992 Spring Quarter Space Utilization Report and asked that this report be used as planning is done for future quarters. He commented on the news concerning a TSUD/Wallace College merger. The Dothan Area Chamber of Commerce plans to form a task force to study the possibilities.

Dr. Lovrich reported on the TSU System Academic Coordinating Council and stated that the charge of the Council is to draw the campuses closer together and to allow for easier transferability of students between campuses.

Dr. Deavers distributed and reviewed information concerning the System Consent Decree Monitoring Committee and the Equal Employment Opportunity subcommittee. He reported on the progress of the TSU System Computer Committee by saying that the committee is reviewing various computers that would satisfy the needs of the System. Dr. Gary Buchanan and Mr. Buzz Wood

are the TSUD representatives on this committee.

Dr. Sublette reported on the System Development Coordinating Council, which coordinates all activities associated with fund raising development activities throughout the System.

Dr. Harrison briefed the Council on the make-up and activities of the TSU System Executive Council. He also reviewed the TSU System structure and how the separately accredited campuses of TSUD and TSUM relate to that structure.

Dr. Goodman reported on the System Microwave Linkage Task Force and its activities related to distance learning. She said she felt at this point that the academic personnel from the three campuses should be involved in the planning process.

Drs. Kennedy and Cross gave an update report on the specialized accreditation status for the School of Education and the School of Business.

The meeting concluded with update reports from all in attendance.

Scholarship Committee

The Scholarship Committee met on May 6 in the Conference Room of Malone Hall. President Harrison spoke to the Committee about the significance of scholarship awards.
