#### ACHE VISITS TSUD CAMPUS

Troy State University at Dothan and George C. Wallace State Community College hosted the visit to the Dothan area by the Alabama Commission on Higher Education (ACHE) on Thursday and Friday, February 10th & 11th.

Thursday's activities included a brief press conference at 1:45 p.m., in 115 Malone Hall on the TSUD campus with Dr. Henry Hector, Executive Director of ACHE, Mr. Borden Morrow, Commission Chairman from Daphne, and Mr. Ben Beard, Commissioner from Troy.

At 2:00 p.m. the Academic Affairs Committee and the Financial Affairs Committee met concurrently. The Student Assistance Committee convened at 4:00 p.m., and committee meetings concluded with the Executive Committee beginning at 4:30 p.m. These committee meetings were held on the TSUD campus.

A dinner for ACHE members and staff, college and university presidents, and other invited guests at Holiday Inn-South in Dothan featured Dr. Thomas Harrison, TSUD President, and Dr. Larry Beaty, Wallace College President, providing a joint presentation on their respective institutions.

The Commission continued its activities at Wallace College on Friday at the 7:30 a.m. breakfast and discussion session with the commissioners and Dr. Hector. Following at 9:30 a.m., ACHE held its Commission meeting. The day concluded with a lunch for ACHE officials.

Dr. Dapper received his bachelor's degree from Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa, and his master's degree from Tennessee Technological University. In 1978, he received his Ph.D. from the University of Southern Mississippi.

Prior to coming to TSUD in September 1989, Dr. Dapper was professor of biology at Mississippi Valley State University in Itta Bena, Missis-

sippi.

sity at Dothan, has been recognized as the "Faculty Member of the Month" for the School of Business.


