TSUD AND THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA SIGN PACT

Officials from Troy State University at Dothan and The University of Alabama gathered recently and signed a cooperative agreement to offer an articulated pre-engineering program at TSUD. Students will have the option of obtaining a Bachelor of Science degree in engineering from The University of Alabama or a B.S. degree in mathematics or physical science from TSUD coupled with the B.S. degree in engineering from The University of Alabama. "The programs in mathematics, physical science, and liberal arts at TSUD as well as the small class sizes combine to provide a high-quality education for the student and increase chances of success during the latter years of engineering education at The University of Alabama," said Dr. Robert Barfield, Dean of the UA College of Engineering.

Programs are available in eight engineering disciplines: aerospace engineering, chemical engineering, civil engineering, electrical engineering, industrial engineering, mechanical engineering, metallurgical engineering, and mineral engineering. Students in electrical engineering may specialize in computer engineering, and students in mineral engineering specialize in either mining engineering or petroleum engineering.

Dr. Jack Sublette, Executive Vice President and Vice President for Student Affairs at TSUD, provided

background information regarding the cooperative effort between the institutions and explained the benefits available to the students in the Wiregrass area. In his comments, Sublette said, "It is gratifying to come to this day when Troy State University at Dothan and The University of Alabama sign this agreement for the benefit of students who prefer to remain in the Wiregrass region for the first part of their engineering education. This agreement will benefit both institutions, but, more importantly, it will provide a great service to the citizens of the Wiregrass. We feel that the two universities have created a model program."

TSUD President, Dr. Thomas Harrison, and UA President, Dr. Roger Sayers, commented on the satisfaction and cooperation between the institutions concerning the agreement.

INTERIM SESSIONS POPULAR

Interim sessions continue to be successful as TSUD students take advantage of the flexible scheduling format. Enrollment for the 1993 Fall Interim Session increased by 3.7% for a total of 223 students. No classes were closed that were offered on the 1993 Fall Interim schedule.

The 1993 Winter Interim Session will be held December 1-17. Classes are listed in the 1993 Fall Quarter Schedule of Classes and will also appear in the 1994 Winter Quarter Schedule of Classes.

DR. STEVEN CROSS

Dr. Steven Cross, Dean of the School of Business at Troy State University at Dothan, has been recognized as the "Faculty Member of the Month" for the School of Business for September.



Dr. Cross received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Middle Tennessee State University, and in 1984, he received his doctorate in economics and finance from Middle Tennessee State University.

Prior to coming to TSUD in 1991, he was Chairman of the Division of Economics and Finance and Professor of Finance at Delta State University. His publications include numerous articles in the Midsouth Journal of Economics and Finance, Journal of Economics and Finance, and Journal of the Mississippi Academy of Sciences.

Dr. Cross is a member of the American Finance Association, Financial Management Association,

American Economic Association, National Association of Business Economists, Midsouth Academy of Economics and Finance, National Education Association, and American Association of University Professors.

His honors include Who's Who in the World, Who's Who in American Education, Who's Who in Finance and Industry, Who's Who of Emerging Leaders in America, Who's Who in the South and Southwest, and Outstanding Young Men in America.
