ENROLLMENT RECORD SET

Troy State University at Dothan announced its enrollment figures for the 1993 Fall Quarter of 2,500 students, a 7.8% increase over the 1992 Fall Quarter figure of 2,319 students. The headcount enrollment of 2,500 marks the largest enrollment in the history of TSUD. This makes twenty-five consecutive quarters that TSUD has surpassed the enrollment for the same quarter of the previous year.

"Factors that continue to be prevalent as I talk to students about their choice of attending TSUD are closeness to home, flexible schedule format, affordability, facilities, faculty, and a caring attitude toward students," stated Tony Whetstone, director of university relations at TSUD.

Dr. Jack Sublette, executive vice president and vice president for student affairs at TSUD, said, "In times when some colleges and universities are experiencing level or declining enrollments, we at TSUD are extremely pleased to see the continued trend in increasing enrollment. In the last few quarters, TSUD has concentrated on offering classes at times and places most convenient for students. We hope to expand the number and kinds of academic programs available in the future. No matter what the program is or what the schedule is, TSUD is dedicated to providing a quality education close to home. At TSUD, this idea is more than a slogan."

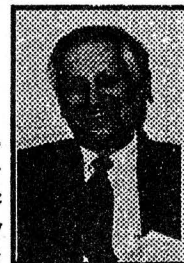
NCATE committee work continues, and all preconditions for NCATE have been met according to

Dr. Lovrich received his bachelor's degree from Southeastern Louisiana State University and his master's degree from the University of South Dakota. In 1962, he received his Ph.D. from South Dakota State University and has completed post doctoral work from the University of Colorado and UCLA.

Prior to coming to TSUD in 1976, he was a professor of sociology at Appalachian State University in Boone, NC. Dr. Lovrich has held teaching positions at Central Missouri State University, Jacksonville State University, South Dakota State University, and Adrian College in Adrian, Michigan. His previous positions at TSUD include professor of sociology and director of institutional research and planning.

Dr. Lovrich has published numerous articles and publications on the American Indian, aging, and the social adaptation of Yugoslavs to the United States. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Alpha Kappa Delta, Southern Sociological Association, Midwest Sociological Association, American Sociological Association, and Society for College and University Planners.

RECORD ENROLLMENT FOR TSUM

Troy State University in Montgomery recently announced a record enrollment of 3,469 students for fall quarter 1993. "We have enjoyed continued growth for years because TSUM is a demand driven university, responding directly to the needs of adult students in our community," said Dr. Glenda S. McGaha, TSUM president. "We realize that we play a crucial role in Montgomery as the area's only evening university dedicated to working men and women, most of whom have job and family responsibilities. We know that lifelong learning is essential to the personal advancement of our students and to the economic development of our community," McGaha added. The fall quarter enrollment figure represents an increase of more than four percent over the previous record set for fall quarter 1992 when 3,331 students attended TSUM.

TROJANS REMAIN UNDEFEATED

The TSU Trojans currently hold a 5-0 record and are ranked 4th in Division I-AA. On Saturday, October 9, the Trojans are host to Liberty University, the only team that defeated the Trojans last year 9-7. The game will take place at 2:00 PM in Troy's Memorial Stadium.

TSU's multiple offense has indeed been multiple this year. After running to win the first three games, the

Trojans have taken to the air the last two weeks to score 92 points.

TSU is averaging 224.8 yards rushing and 170.6 passing.
