TSUD TO INSTALL DR. MICHAEL MALONE AS UNIVERSITY'S THIRD PRESIDENT

Since May 1996, Dr. Michael E. Malone has been president of Troy State University Dothan. On Friday, April 18, 1997, the university community will make his presidency official with a Presidential Installation Ceremony on the TSUD campus.

A committee has been working for the past several months to insure that the community celebration will be one to remember. Dr. Malone's interests and favorite topics have been woven into a series of activities which will precede the ceremony. Those interests center around nature, wellness, technology, and the arts.

Author Bob Inman, a friend of Dr. Malone's and Elba native, was at Books-A-Million in Northside Mall on Wednesday, April 2, from 7:00 - 8:30 P.M. During that time he signed copies of his book *Dairy Queen Days*.

A concert by the TSUD Community Band will be held at the Dothan High School Alumni Memorial Auditorium at 7:00 P.M. on April 14, in honor of Dr. Malone. Musical selections will include marches, Broadway hits, patriotic music, major concert band works, and a selection of Dr. Malone's favorite Gershwin melodies entitled *Gershwin*. Dr. John M. Long, director of bands and dean of the School of Fine Arts at Troy State University, will be a guest conductor for the concert. The concert is free and open to the public.

A Health and Wellness Fair will be held in Malone Hall on Tuesday, April 15, from 9:00 A.M. until Noon. Numerous agencies will be on campus to provide a variety of health screenings and to showcase the latest in health and wellness. This event is co-sponsored by the TSUD Student Government Association. Dedication Ceremony for Dr. Malone will take place on the TSUD campus at 1:30 P.M. on April 15. Dr. Parviz Parsa, professor of economics at TSUD, has donated ten trees in honor of Dr. Malone and his official installation.

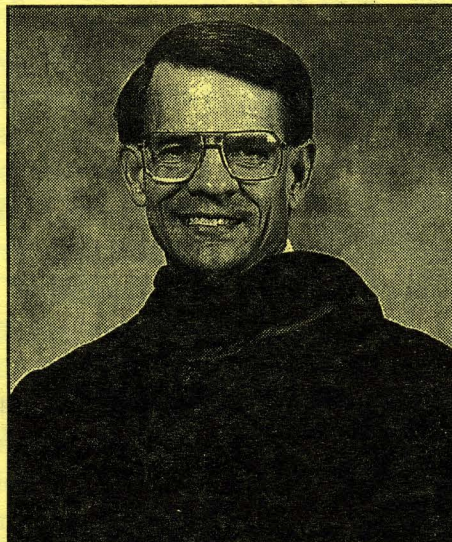
To showcase faculty member's academic works, two presentations will be given on the TSUD campus on Wednesday, April 16. The School of Education will host a Brown-Bag Lunchtime presentation from Noon until 1:00 P.M. with Dr. Anne Lorance, assistant professor of elementary education, giving a presentation on *Creek Indian Nations: Past and Present*. From Noon until 4:00 P.M., Dr. Dorinda Van Loo, professor

of philosophy, will host the Fourth Annual Bereavement Teleconference *Living With Grief*, sponsored by Hospice Foundation and coordinated by TSUD Continuing Education.

Thursday is the day set aside for technological advances at TSUD. Dr. Lannes L. Morris-Murphy, assistant professor of MIS in the School of Business, and members of the TSUD Techno-Team will unveil TSUD's Web Page followed by a TSUD Family reception. This technology event will take place in the Harrison Room in Malone Hall at 1:00 P.M.

Friday culminates the series of community activities with the installation of Dr. Michael E. Malone as the third president of Troy State University Dothan. The Presidential Installation Ceremony will begin at

10:00 A.M. in front of Malone Hall. Numerous dignitaries—local, state, national, and international—will be present to offer greetings from their respective constituents. The TSU Symphony Band will provide music prior to and during the ceremony. A special feature within the processional will be the playing of bagpipes by members of the St. Andrews Pipe Band from Montgomery. A reception will be held in Malone Hall immediately following the ceremony.

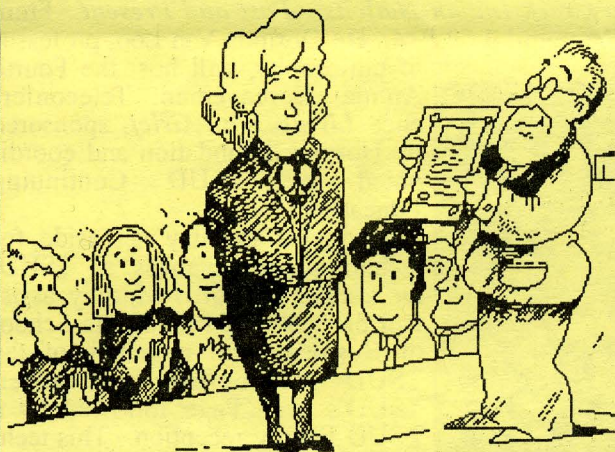
CAPS OFF - A BIG HIT

Diana Parker received the meal for two from The Old Mill for winter quarter for having received fourteen (14) CAPS OFF cards.

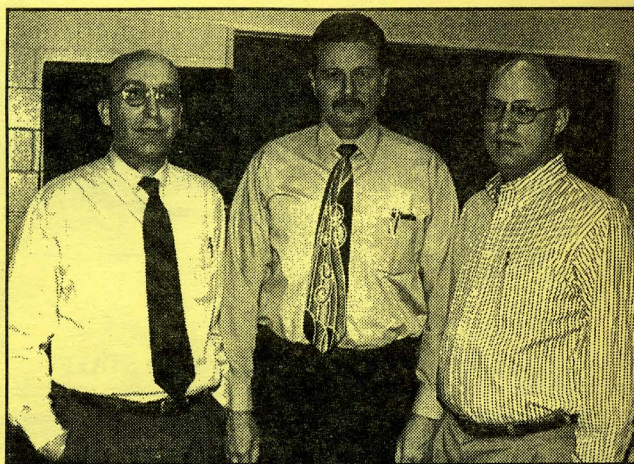

TSUD Faculty Member and Students Receive Certification

Two students and a professor at TSUD recently passed the Microsoft Certification Exam for Visual Basic 4.0. The exam demonstrates to current or potential employers and customers that an individual has mastered the skills to implement, maintain, and troubleshoot applications using the Visual Basic programming language.

The newly redesigned Computer Information Systems (CIS) and Management Information Systems (MIS) programs at TSUD are built around Microsoft development products. Visual Basic is the major component of the client/server programming track in CIS, and Microsoft Office Professional is the end-user application development environment emphasized in MIS. As Microsoft products take an increasing share of the marketplace, the demand for certified trained personnel has risen. The goal of these new programs at TSUD is to provide the student with the conceptual and technical skills to compete in today's information age job environment.

The two students who took the exam, Tom McAllister (middle), Dothan, and Alton DeWeese (R), Dothan, had just completed the new capstone programming course CIS 447-System Design and Implementation. This course was taught by Dr. Gary Buchanan (L), chairman of the Computer Information Systems department at TSUD.

LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS

The Alabama House voted a 1% increase in allocations for higher education in Fiscal Year 1998. The Alabama Senate Finance and Taxation Committee voted a 2% increase. But that's not all. The Finance and Taxation Committee voted approximately a 12% increase for TSUD in recognition of the equity funding issue we have been pushing for several years.

This amount is not the full equity funding amount, but it is a nice addition in a year when others may have to settle for 1-2% and our Governor would prefer level funding.

Senator Chip Bailey of Dothan is spearheading this issue in the Senate. If the full Senate votes to concur, the budget (including our increase) goes to Conference Committee. Stay Tuned!

Following Fall Quarter's reorganization, the newly formed Student and Community Affairs Division has been using a series of flyers to inform the internal TSUD community of what the division is and does. For example, did you know that in 1995-96, Admissions and Records processed nearly 2,000 applications for new admissions, or that Financial Aid processed over \$4,000,000 in student aid, or that Continuing Education enrolled over 3,600 students, or that Counseling Services assisted 212 disabled students? There will be more flyers to come from other Student and Community Affairs Division functions--administrative services, alumni affairs, data and research services, recruiting, student activities, and the ISC.
