



TROY UNIVERSITY FIRST YEAR LEARNING COMMUNITIES

Learning communities are small groups of students who share academic characteristics and enroll together in common courses across their first year. Learning communities are a great way to meet other students, while being connected to faculty and staff on-campus. Troy University offers 8 different Learning Communities to suit a wide variety of student's interests and academic needs.

How Learning Communities work: Students who sign up to join a learning community take 3 general studies courses together centered on a particular topic. Through the courses, students engage in applied learning through curricular and co-curricular activities.

How do I sign up? Students interested in joining a Learning Community can sign up through their IMPACT leader while on campus for new student orientation (IMPACT).

2014 LEARNING COMMUNITIES OFFERED

Sustainability – LC focused on exploration of environmental issues and sustainability

Healthy Futures – make a difference in the Troy community through the lives of youth, children and the community agencies that serve them

Alabama Issues – get connected to state and local issues and ways that you can affect change through this LC focused on public service and applied leadership.

Leadership – LC designed to build the skills and capabilities of emerging leaders at TROY

Creative Habit – LC designed exclusively for Dance and Theatre Majors focused on the performance and production side of both disciplines.

Explore (Undeclared) – LC that assists undeclared students in major and career decision making

Passage - designed to assist conditionally admitted students in developing skills needed for self-directed learning and college success

What if I want to be involved in other activities on campus? Campus involvement is encouraged! A learning community is a great place to get to know others; however, it is important to participate in the full array of opportunities at TROY such as student organizations, residence halls, Greek life, intramurals, and more.

Who is eligible to participate? Incoming first year students. Additionally, students must fit criteria specific to the learning communities they select.
